

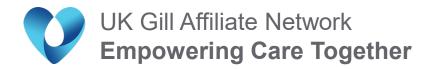



#### **OBJECTIVES**



- 3. Commit to one actionable way to strengthen a culture of care within their organization.




## EXPECTED OUTCOME & EDUCATIONAL NEED/ PRACTICE GAP

- Expected Outcome: Participants renew connection to purpose, compassion, and shared responsibility, leading to stronger cultures of care.
- Educational Need: Healthcare teams need frameworks that move beyond individual resilience toward collective well-being and values-based workplace cultures.
- **Practice Gap:** Many healthcare systems undervalue the care of caregivers, resulting in burnout and disconnection; optimal practice embeds compassion, purpose principles, and collective accountability into organizational culture.

Those who care for others deserve systems that care for them.









#### LESSON 1: PURPOSE


Purpose is our light.

#### LESSON 2: COMPASSION


Strength and healing happen through connection.






#### LESSON 3: COLLECTIVE RESPONSIBILITY

Strength comes from holding each other up and standing up for what matters most.






